The Port of Vilagarcía is a logistics platform that speeds up and enhances the industrial activity of a large number of companies in our area of influence.







The diversification of maritime cargo transport operations in the port of Vilagarcía has provided its operators and the Port Authority itself with capacity and experience in handling various types of merchandise, including containerized goods.

Total lenght of quays in the Port of Vilagarcía is almost 3,000 metres. Most docks (seven out of nine, totaling 2.665 metres of length) have a depth of water of 11-13 metres.

We have infrastructures and equipment for the handling of general merchandise (including containerized cargo), solid bulk and liquid bulk.

For the correct development of port operations, the Port of Vilagarcía has several terminals focused on a certain type of traffic, as well as large dockside areas for storage, both covered and uncovered.

An expanding hinterland

Vilagarcia port plays a strategic role in trade for diverse companies in our area of influence, and contributes to the creation and conservation of employment not only in industry but also in haulage and logistics

Land communications are one of the strengths of the port of Vilagarcía. The port has a direct link to the Atlantic Motorway (AP-9), the main artery between north and south Galicia, and which also connects with "Northwest" and "Rías Baixas" dual carriageways, thereby allowing the transport of goods to and from the entire northwest of the Iberian peninsula. It also has easy access to the rest of the O Salnés region through a corridor.

As far as rail is concerned, the port can offer this service at all its commercial docks, connecting through a 1.2 km branch with the conventional Railway Network.

The availability of maritime-rail intermodal transport contributes to the expansion of the hinterland of the port of Vilagarcía, since the movement of merchandise by train is especially attractive in the middle distance and towards the interior of the peninsula.
